## Reading At Home Program:


We are very excited to launch our new Reading at Home Program. This program has been designed to expose the children to more books and frequency in reading.

If you would like to continue this at home please come and talk to Ms. Tam so that she can give you the proper writing sheets needed. <b>Week Two</b> (Apr 12 <sup>th</sup> – 16 <sup>th</sup> )	Drawing Skills Ask your child about their drawing: what are they drawing? Is this the mouth of the alligator you are drawing? Wow!
